



## The Tryall Club Sustainability Best Practices

Save what we have! Protect the beauty that we know!

### Protect Our Water

- Check all main lines for leaks, particularly to washrooms and bathrooms. Report all leaks promptly.
- Check for leaky hoses in irrigation systems, particularly on walkways. Persistent tall grass and wet spots should not happen with a sound irrigation system.
- Always try to wash a full load when using washing machines (or dryers).
- Always use a nozzle when washing surfaces or watering plants. It's faster and more efficient.
- Use a spray boom/power wash machine to wash down surfaces.
- Report any pool works to Villa Management and Environmental Office that includes makeup water from backwashing.
- Tell Guests about the Club's Conservation policy to reuse towels and linens.

### Save Light and Power

Electricity generation releases Greenhouse gases that cause Climate Change.

- Practice strict lockdown procedures when the villa is not occupied. Shut down all equipment, clean them, and plug them out if it is safe to do so. Never leave empty or not in use appliances plugged in.
- All pool pumps should be the inverter type and they should be set to a regular schedule at installation.
- Carts should only be plugged in until fully charged and then the charger disconnected and unplugged.
- Check that all doors and windows are sealed whenever AC is on in a room. Check insulation on the ducts and clean filters regularly to reduce the energy load.
- Check generators regularly and read your meter after power outages or once per month.
- Use only LED or CFL bulbs and always check that timers and sensors are working.
- Tell Guests about the Club's Conservation policy and technology that protects the environment.

### Protect Environmental Health

- Do not capture or endanger wild animals.
- Look out for and eliminate mosquito and invasive species breeding sites. Encourage and promote healthy fish and reptile ponds that will control pests.
- Always seek ways to reduce outdoor light glare or pollution that attract animals to Villas instead of their natural nesting areas.
- Always seek ways to reduce noise and never run machinery (e.g. blowers) before or after 8 o'clock.
- Quickly clean up any chemical (oil or grease) spills. Report any wastewater pollution promptly.
- Lights by the seaside should be covered or tinted to prevent light pollution from affecting wildlife.

### Reduce, Reuse and Recycle

- All plastic bottles, tins and cardboard should be separated for recycling center pickup.
- Household garbage should be placed in bins and not include any recyclables. Separate them.
- Trash recycles are **ONLY** for tree trimmings or grass and coconuts. Use biodegradable bags for trash for compost pickup. Practice composting for better gardens.
- Construction or large appliances or furniture must not be abandoned anywhere on or around Tryall.
- Never walk pass trash or contribute to the flight of trash. Share in the *Dappa Tryall* mantra!
- Cooking oil recycling drums are at the Beach Kitchen. Never dump oils or chemicals in drains.
- Always try to repurpose items before disposal. Old soft items, such as towels, should be upcycled to rags and never thrown in the garbage.
